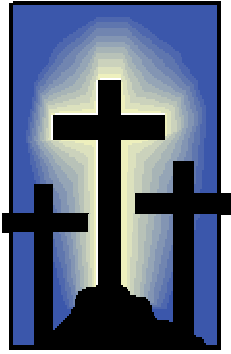

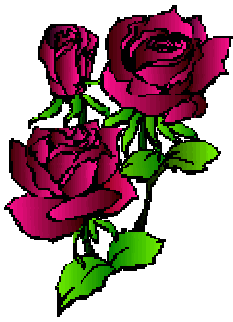

St. Paul's Lutheran Church Project Updates

Property Committee:

The repair and remounting of the church gutters have been completed. Two additional downspouts were installed to prevent overflowing which had occurred due to poor drainage. This project was completed by Brothers Services for a cost of \$3,560.00; much of which was donated to the church recently by friends and members.

The hatch in the bell cupola was secured to prevent water and birds from gaining access to the church attic.

The air-conditioning and heat systems were inspected and tested by Modern Comfort Systems and were deemed in good condition.

Repairing and repainting the wood sign in the park area by Woodland Signs was completed. The sign lettering was repainted with gold leaf and plastic signs were updated to reflect the church service times for summer and the rest of the year. This project was paid for from memorial funds. Solar floodlights will be installed to light the sign in the evenings.

Future projects include painting the trim around the roofline of the church, installing wrap on the porch of the parsonage, evaluating the roof and parking lot for possible repairs and upgrades and many smaller projects.

Park Committee:

The playground for the park has been started as of this writing. This is a custom designed playground and is being installed by a professional company who specializes in this field. They have been contracted to install the fabric, mulch and border after the playground is completed. Unfortunately there is a missing component which will not be available until the end of January but by the time you read this the installation should have been finished. This is a first class playground and should last for decades. We invite all members of the community to use the playground and hope that many people will enjoy having a quality playground in our neighborhood. Future projects for the playground include benches and a "spinner" for the older children. Future projects for the park include a pavilion and storage building for which we are actively fundraising this year and hope to complete as soon as possible. The pavilion will provide a space for outdoor services, picnics, theater and the flea market as well as other uses. The pavilion is planned for the space between the playground and the CSX train tracks. Our long term project for the park area is a building which would house the education, ministry and social activities; some of which are ongoing but need additional space to grow. The pavilion and playground are the first phases of this long range plan.

All of these projects are possible due to the generosity and caring of many friends and members of St. Paul's without whom they would not be possible. We have a beautiful church and we are acting as good stewards. The outreach to the community, which the playground and pavilion will provide, should help us to be active and important members of our town and hopefully will establish more of a partnership with our neighbors.

Jill, who goes to school with Sophia, is always happy to be in preschool and is doing quite well. Jessie will be three in April and loves all of the attention that she gets from everyone who stops by their house. Life is progressing one day at a time.
