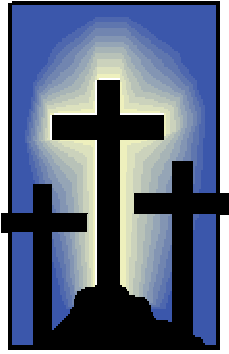

“As the sun was setting, all those who had any who were sick with various kinds of diseases brought them to him (Jesus) and he laid his hands on each of them and cured them” (Luke 4:40).

“Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed” (James 5: 13-16a).

As many of you know, Pastor Mike Adams and I have been leading joint healing services the third Wednesday of each month except during Lent. Many of you may say I'm not sick so I don't need to go to this service. The fact is, we are all in need of healing whether physically, mentally, emotionally or spiritually. The Lord's Supper is served so we are assured also of the forgiveness of sins as we partake of the body and blood of Christ.

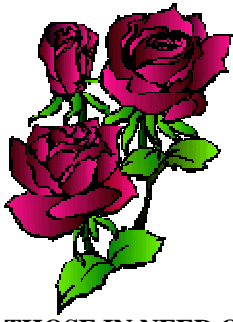
Some of you may not be so taken with the anointing and laying on of hands. But, the above scripture asks us to do just that. The laying on of hands is a significant gesture of blessing that recalls the promises of our Baptism. In Baptism pastors lay both hands on the newly baptized and is an acknowledgement and expression of the bestowing of the Holy Spirit and the prayer offered is for the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

This laying on of hands is connected to not only healing but absolving and blessings. This gesture of touch is a way of conveying love, care, and compassion. The laying on of hands can be done by groups or individuals when they go out into the community and surround a person in need of support with prayer and a touch to the head or shoulder. God's love and the prayers are embodied by the community of faith when this action is performed.

So with these thoughts in mind and at the command of Jesus, may we all be healed by touch and anointing, not only in our Healing Services but, whenever we pray, anoint, and touch anyone in need. Whatever brokenness you have that needs healing, come to our worship service of healing and be touched by God's healing love.
