Biblical scholars believe that the Gospel of Luke and the Book of Acts were written by the same person. Together those two books tell the story of Jesus and then his first followers as they became the Christian Church. The stories in both Luke and Acts emphasize caring for others, being generous, sharing life together, and living in community.

- 3 What does it mean to be generous?
- 4 Create a "Family Tree" that includes all of the people in your family's life. Make branches for friends and neighbors, service workers, teachers, and church workers. See how big that tree can get when you add everyone in. What would it be like to bring all of those people together?



Eye Spark

When you see a lot of something, think about how that can be shared with someone who doesn't have much.



Ear Spark

When you hear somebody talking about Jesus, share what you know about Jesus and God, too!

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LIVE IT

For families to do together

Designate a spot in your home where you can collect things in a Share Box. Perhaps you'll choose some food for a food shelf, some outgrown clothing, or a few favorite toys and books. Set this collection spot up so that it is easy to fill the Share Box and drop it off at the places where the things can be used.

For younger kids

Go through your toys and find some to pass on. They might be favorite toys, they might be toys you don't play with anymore, or they might be toys that you have more than one of. Find a place to share them!

For older kids

Organize a kid-garage sale or stand to sell lemonade or cookies. Donate the money to an organization that helps out those who need a little extra help. If you describe the organization on your sign, you'll probably get more donations!
