"From the Pastor"

"Beginning with Moses and all the prophets, Jesus interpreted to them the things about himself in all the scriptures... When he was at table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him." Luke 24:27, 30-31a

"The baptized devoted themselves to the breaking of bread and prayers." Acts 2:42

"On Sunday all are gathered together in unity. The records of the apostles or the writings of the prophets are read for as long as time allows. The presider exhorts and invites us into the pattern of these good things. Then we all stand and offer prayer. When we have concluded the prayer, bread is set out together with wine...The presider then offers prayer and thanksgiving and the people sing out their assent, saying the "Amen." There is a distribution of the things over which thanks has been said and each person participates, and these things are sent to those who are not present.

Those who are prosperous give what they wish according to each one's own choice, and the collection is deposited with the presider, who aids orphans and widows, those in want because of disease, those in prison, and foreigners who are staying here. We hold this meeting together on Sunday since it is the first day, on which God, having transformed darkness and matter, created the world. On the same day Jesus Christ our Savior rose from the dead. On Sunday, he appeared to his apostles and disciples and taught them these things we present to you."

Apology of Justin Martyr circa 150 A.D.

The readings above are descriptions of how the early church gathered together and worshiped. Several things stand out to me as I read these: scriptures were read (Moses and the prophets, apostles and the prophets), interpretation was offered (Jesus interpreted to them, the presider exhorts and invites), bread is broken, wine is poured, prayers are offered up, offering is taken up in thanksgiving to support the church and to aid those in need. These things sound like the very things we do in worship today. This means that the very form of our Lutheran liturgical worship has its roots deep within the history of...all the way back to the very beginning of that history when Jesus first gathered his disciples to teach and eat with them.

Good things happened during worship. As they remembered darkness being transformed into light, creation itself was celebrated. The baptized were fortified and blessed through the confession and forgiveness and the singing and praying. Those gathered were renewed for the daily witness of faith, hope, and love. Guest, strangers, and all in need, were offered these good things through God's grace freely given and celebrated. Jesus, himself, was present in the reading and exhorting of the scripture and through the bread and wine of communion. These good things still happen as we are gathered in worship even today.

School is almost over, summer is almost in full swing. As you take time to refresh and renew this summer, whether it be through time spent on vacation, time spent with family and friends, or just time spent enjoying God's creation, remember the importance of worshiping together. Remember the good things that come as we gather with friends, family, and strangers to lift our hearts is song, prayer, and communion. Come to worship here when you are at home. Seek this gathering out online when you are away. Continue to support the ministries that we are doing together. Be renewed and blessed as you do so. Have a safe and blessed summer.

Synod Assembly Update



Kelly and Sandy attended the 36th annual Delaware-Maryland Synod Assembly on June 9-10, at Grace Lutheran Church in Westminster. Typically, the Assembly is held in Ocean City, with a few years in Hunt Valley. This year the Synod decided to try something different and hold it at a Synod church. The changing of the venue was met with positive feedback; one being that it saved over \$50,000 in registration fees.

The Westminster Conference was on full display during the two day event with a lunch option at Carroll Lutheran School, tours of Carroll Lutheran Village, CLV buses being used to shuttle participants from parking lots, a walk/run event Saturday morning, and many participants taking advantage of being in beautiful downtown Westminster. The members of Grace Lutheran did a wonderful job hosting the event.

The annual assembly is held to conduct business that is an important part of our church lives and ministry together as a Synod. This year's assembly theme was, "But for the grace of God we go!", and all offerings were divided between relief ministries of our synod and the ELCA.

There were more than 360 voting members attending the event. Kelly and Sandy officially represented St Paul's, but since there were no other lay voting members from the other parish churches, we were also recognized as members of the Resurrection Lutheran Parish, which was mentioned at least two times for being the only five church parish in our Synod. Pr Ellen and Deacon Don also attended, and Madison was a visitor on Saturday.

Highlights from the Assembly

- Approved various reports, the financial audit, and the 2024 Faith Spending Plan
- Elected a new Synod Vice President Ms Jada Wright (Jerusalem, Baltimore)
- We recognized outgoing Vice President (of seven years) John Auger (Grace, Hockessin)
 - Appointed various lay people and pastors to committees within the Synod organization, including:
 - Consultation Committee David Magoon (Grace, Hockessin) and the Rev. Zachary Wright (Bethel, North East)
 - Discipline Committee April Parvizian (Epiphany, Baltimore) and the Rev. Kelley Ketcham (St. Mark's Wilmington)
 - Rev. Christopher Schaefer (Divinity, Towson) as Team Leader for the Communications Team
 - Adopted three resolutions:
 - Resolution 2023-1: Global Church Sunday
 - Resolution 2023-2: Compensation Guidelines
 - Resolution 2023-3: Promoting Transgender
 Competency in the Delaware-Maryland Synod
 - The Rev. Dr. Surekha Nelavala (Global Peace, Frederick) lead two thought provoking Bible Study sessions



- We heard reports from Mar-Lu-Ridge, who is starting a Capital Campaign to make the Ridge accessible to all, and from Youth and Family Ministry and their programs throughout the year for our youth.
- Opening worship was held in the sanctuary with Rev. Harvard Stephens preaching.

- Closing worship was held in Grace Hall with Grace's Praise Singers and Praise Band leading us in worship.
- The Synod Worship Team selected music from the new Evangelical Lutheran Worship supplement, *All Creation Sings*, and each attendee received a copy.
- Bishop Bill Gohl enjoyed his time with all of us.
- Kelly and Sandy catching up with Pr Carl.



Council Meeting Highlights

4/18/2023 Approved Council Meeting Minutes

Reports

Pastor's Report, Pastor Ellen Reported:

- Preached and presided at 10 worship services, including 5 Sundays, and Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday
- Led midweek worship/prayer & Lectio Divina Bible reflection on March 15, 22 & 29
- St. Paul's
- Attended the visitation and funeral of Paul Dattilio, officiated by Pastor Dot and priest from St. Bartholomews, at Eckhardt's Funeral Home on April 2 and April 3
- Officiated graveside service for Larry Shaffer, New Lutheran Cemetery, and attended visitation at Eckhardt's Funeral Home, March 25
- Attended 3 Confirmation classes led by Deacon Don Helfer
- Attended monthly Council meetings at
- Immanuel
- Jerusalem
- St. Paul's
- St. Peter's
- Attended Parish Council meeting on March 30 at St. Abrahams
- Had pastoral visits with 10+ Resurrection Parish members; and made several pastoral phone calls, as needed
- Attended 2 clergy team staff meeting during this period
- Assisted with Social Ministry's food distribution at Immanuel every Wednesday
- Participated in Immanuel's monthly Christian Education meeting with Deacon Don
- Met with Jeff Branch, Director at Carroll Lutheran Village, along with Pastor Dot

Pastor Dot Reported:

- During the months of February thru April, I presided over 27 regular worship services, two Ash Wednesday Services. I missed 1 Sunday due to the emergency fly out to be with my Mother at the beginning of March. I also led three Midweek Lenten Prayer/Taize services. I had to cancel two services. One due to the emergency fly out to be with my Mother and the second, due to being in the hospital with a family as they moved through the dying process with their loved one. Taught a First Communion Class, presided over a First Communion Service and Blessing of a new Paschal Candle.
- Trying to work into this new role, as Senior Pastor of the Pastoral Team, I worked with the Team and churches to develop the Pastoral Rotation Schedule, collected information and assisted with 1099's and filing tax forms, assembled and reported Synodical Congregational Reports (and am still in this process with some congregations), setting up, combining, and cleaning up various visitation lists and separating out shut-ins from regular home visitations (with the help of various members of the congregations and Pastor Ellen), and other reports, inquiries, etc., as needed for the Parish and the congregations. Working with bulletins, newsletters, Monthly Update, working with everyone to set up Lenten, Holy Week
- Attended two Westminster Conference meetings, at least 2 meetings with the Bishop's staff, our own Pastoral Team meetings, Stephen Ministry meetings, 9 congregational council meetings, and at least 30 pastoral counseling (some by phone and some in person), 6 funerals/Memorial Services, 33 home communions with shut-ins, hospital visits, and many phone calls and emails. Attended the Synod Renewal of Vows Service.
- Supported Deacon Don and Pastor Ellen by attending a confirmation class, a few Youth activities, a Mario's Dinner, and
 assisting in a small part at a Mar-Lu-Ridge Chapel service. Met with Kelley and Pastor Norma for the Ukraine Parish
 Project.
- I know that there is more that I have done over the months of February and March but during my flight back from my emergency fly out to my Mother's, I lost my calendar book in one of the airports so do not have the total written report of activities.
- Looking ahead to streamlining some of the paperwork systems, computer systems, etc. Also, working with Pastor Ellen to set up a regular shut-in visitation schedule and then on to setting up a plan for reaching out to the community to grow our churches.
- The Lord has blessed us with His tremendous gift of love and renewal and with and through the gifts of each other. Even though we may struggle as we are forming this parish, I know the Holy Spirit is hard at work among us. Looking forward to serving on our continuing journey together as the Resurrection Lutheran Parish, our Pastoral Team, and the individual churches that make up this Parish.

Treasurer's Report, Ms. Mountcastle Reported:

- The PNC credit card was still open, will work on closing the card
- The Go Daddy! Account will be switched over to the new credit card

Committee Reports

Parish Council, Ms. Caine Reported:

- The minutes from our January 25th meeting were approved. (in the 2023, Secretary, Minutes folder)
- Will be included in the April St. Paul's newsletter
- The treasurer report was approved. (in the 2023, Secretary, Minutes folder)
- Will be included in the April St. Paul's newsletter
- The pastors gave very substantial reports please be assured that they are working hard for the parish and our church.
- The Call Committee reported that the 5 church councils all approved Pastor Dot, Pastor Ellen, and Deacon Don as the slate for the Parish Call. All congregations will vote on May 7th with either the Bishop or the Assistant to the Bishop. (details to come...) The congregations will vote on the team as a whole, not for individuals. Pastor Dot is considered the senior pastor, as she has been doing this the longest and has the most experience. She is ultimately the one person held responsible by the Bishop (and any law enforcement agencies) if there is a problem in the parish. The pastoral team is working on ironing out a list of responsibilities for each of the three pastoral team members that will be forwarded to each congregation. At this time, if you need anything, contact any of the three and they will be happy to help or point us in the correct direction. If any of the pastoral team members decide to leave, it would be handled as if a regular pastor left a church an interim would be assigned and we would proceed like any other call to find a new pastor.
- We invited all of the parish churches to join St. Paul's at Hampstead Day. Whether they would like to participate in person, or just have information available for us to hand out is TBD. Mary would suggest that we send a parish-wide email (somehow?) to invite them again.
- As of right now, we are going to keep with a monthly parish newsletter email update, with the option to send out "emergency" emails, as needed. If you have thoughts/concerns please speak to Sandy or Mary.
- At our next meeting Pr Dot will present a draft 2024 budget. The draft budget will then be presented at the five church
 council's and any comments/changes will be brought back to the parish council meeting in July. A final budget will be
 available to the churches by September to allow time to work all numbers into our individual budgets.

Outreach, Ms. Lyons Reported:

- With the help of several youths, we delivered 80 Easter bags to the residents of Autumn Lake at Long View on Palm Sunday. We also brought them palms from our service which several residents commented on how much they appreciated those.
- Delivery of Tide pods was made to the Women's Housing Coalition. We were made aware of their Amazon Wish List-mostly kitchenware.
- The weather kept us from opening the grill this month. I'll apply the expenses to May's report.

Flea Market, Ms. Lyons Reported:

- Our April 15th Flea Market was sold out! 84 vendors prepaid. (kept "2" spaces as security) 78 lawn spaces (\$1950.00) and 6 pavilion spaces (180.00)
- Out of those 84 vendors, only 27 showed up because of the bad weather. Apparently whoever made the effort sold very
 well! Susan found a couple new potential spaces in the lawn area. Will be asking Rachel to update our map.
- So far, our Flea Market has made \$9,930.00 this year!

Sunday School, Ms. Fleming reported:


