

In recognition of his dedication to the school, beginning in 2024, this golf tournament will be named The Robert Fischer Memorial Golf Tournament. The tournament will continue to raise funds for the scholarship fund, but the scholarship fund will now be a living legacy in Bob's name.

## Pastor's Report, Pastor Dot Reported:
