"From the Pastor"

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth...God saw all that he had made, and it was very good." Genesis 1:1; 1:31.

As I am sitting at my desk looking out the window at the snow still falling outside and covering everything in a blanket of white, I can see the goodness that God created. Everywhere I look, it is filled with the bright light of snow as it piles up on all the trees, cars, parking lots, and rooftops. It is beautiful. It is also truly amazing to me how God's creation still works even though we know it has been changed by our neglect sometimes as we have been living in it.

If you read the first chapter of Genesis, it tells the story of how much delight God has in what God created. All that God formed is meant to bring forth life and the life it brings forth is the joy and the light of the world that we were created and formed to live within. God declared it good! Just as God declares each of us good as we are welcomed into this light at our birth. But as our world continues on into brokenness, and our lives overwhelm us at times, it is hard to hold on to or even see that light. This is the amazing thing about the time in the church year called Epiphany! It reminds us that the light, God's light, is still there and we still matter.

I want to share with you a reading, a poem really, a resource called "How does a weary world rejoice?" from Sanctified Art. It is called "The Bravest Thing We Can Do" and is written by Rev. Sarah (Are) Speed.

"Trust your belovedness. Let it be a protest, an act of resistance, a song of celebration. Trust your belovedness in a world that is rarely satisfied. Wear it like a badge of honor. Speak it as confidently as your last name. Tattoo it to your heart. When outside forces chip asway at your sense of self, when life asks you to hand over the keys, remember the water. Remember creation. Remember how it was good, so very good. Let that truth hum through your veins. Sing it so loud that it drowns out the weariness of the world, for the bravest thing we can ever do is trust that we belong."



Highlights from the October 17,2023 Council Meeting

Reports:

Pastor's Report, Pastor Ellen Reported:

- Pastor Dot and I continue to make regular pastoral care visits and calls to those on our parish visitation list. Deacon Don makes visits also when he has time. I visited 8 homebound and 1 hospitalized parishioner since September 19, and made 20 pastoral phone calls. All visits included communion and prayer.
- Pastor Dot, Deacon Don, and I continue to have regular staff meetings. They are now weekly on Mondays at 6:30 pm at Carroll Lutheran Village. I remain active with the weekly food pantry and distribution on Wednesday mornings at Immanuel, a subgroup of their Social Ministry Committee. We are also helping a woman and her son who were previously on the streets to get set up in their apartment in Manchester with used furniture, and other household items
- Attending as many of the 5 congregation's Council meetings as I am available for. I attended the Christian Education meeting at Immanuel in October.
- Had a good women's retreat at MLR on Saturday, October 14. 20 participants from Grace Lutheran and Immanuel Lutheran. Theme was Sabbath rest, and holy leisure.
- Immanuel women are already talking about wanting to start a parish women's group, similar to the 'Holy Girlfriends' group at Grace which sponsored the retreat. Talking to Debbie Mace about it. She is keen to get something started. More news to follow on that once I meet with Debbie.
- Parish Bible study continues to go well, I think. Our new study is on Genesis, using the Book of Faith Series by Augsburg Fortress. We usually have anywhere from 8 to 12 participants. Continue to meet on 1 st and 3 rd Wednesdays at 7pm here at St. Paul's. All are welcome. Come when you can.
- Saturday evening worship service was "resurrected" at Immanuel on September 23. It is the 4th Saturday evening of the month. These are open to the parish, and I encourage you to come. We had 16 people attend. Saturday evening services have a meditative, intimate, and ethereal feel to them.
- Pastor Dot and I participated in a DE-MD synod sponsored webinar for Women in Ministry with Dr. Crystal Hall, former New Testament professor at United Lutheran Seminary. It was a 4-week webinar during September.
- Pickleball group ministry, still in the works. Rachel got some information for me and a contact for the North Carroll Middle School PB indoor court, but haven't contacted him yet. No one under 18 allowed to play. My idea is that it could be an intergenerational sport ministry, meaning we want to include and encourage youth to participate, if they are interested.
- Monthly pastoral counseling meeting with a young Israeli American woman recovering from an eating disorder. She feels overwhelmed by a number of things in her life, most recently, the Israeli / Gaza conflict. Her dietician and therapist are maintaining frequent contact with her, and she said this is helping. She is a spiritual person and has a lot to share about what she's been through. I am working on writing a book. And would welcome the opportunity to speak to a group of people also. Could we invite her to speak to the parish or the congregations?
- Went on a one-week cruise (Sept 24-30) with a friend I've had since childhood, Andrea Pritts, who is a Methodist
 pastor in Ohio. She turned 60 in September and "insisted" that I go on a cruise with her to celebrate! How could I say
 No?!

Pastor Dot Reported:

- During the month of September 13-October 10, I presided over 7 regular worship services and 1 Saturday Night Service. Attended 4 Council Meetings, 3 Staff Meetings, 1 Stephen Ministry meeting, 4 online sessions for continuing education, 2 of the Parish Women's Bible Studies.
- Assisted with bulletins, and worship music CD prep, attended and helped serve at 1 Community Breakfast.
- Had 5 pastoral counseling (some in person and some by phone). Attended two funeral visitations, presided at 2 funerals, 12 home communions, 2 hospital visits, 2 Hospice visits, and many hours of phone calls, texts, and emails.
- Oh, yes, and we were Installed!
