"You have made us for yourself, and our heart is restless until it rests in you."

~from *The Confessions* of St. Augustine of Hippo (circa 400 AD)

Jesus said: "Come to me all you who are weary and carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me for I am gentle and humble in heart and you will find rest for your souls. "

~Matthew 11:28-30

As we continue our journey through Lent 2024 and turn back toward God acknowledging our need for Him, and seeking rest for our souls and wandering hearts, St. Augustine of Hippo's words come to mind, as do the words of Jesus to his followers. Our hearts are restless until they find rest in God. Jesus found this rest and mastered it, and he offers it to all who follow him and his Way.



Our Parish teen ministry group has some exciting news to share with you. We subscribed to an online video-based curriculum called Right Now Media.



Council Meeting Highlights

Highlights from the November 21, 2023 Council Meeting

Pastor Dot Reported:

- During the month of October 11-November 14, I:
- Presided over 7 regular worship services and 1 Saturday Night Service, and 1 Folk Service
- Attended 4 Council Meetings, 4 Staff Meetings, 1 Jt. Council Meeting, 1 Mutual Ministry Meeting, a Parish Worship and Music meeting and a Parish Women's Bible Study.
- Assisted with bulletins, and worship music CD preparation
- Attended and helped at the Community Breakfast and St. Abrahams Apple Butter Day
- Working on administrative duties- payroll/portico set up. Pastoral rotations, Staff Partnership document and Annual pastoral report, one meeting with Bishop's Staff
- Helped a church member with a move
- Confirmation planning and Evangelism Committee meeting
- Attended one Annual Congregational Meeting
- Had 8 pastoral counseling (some in person and some by phone)
- Attended 1 funeral, 23 home communion, 4 hospital visits and many hours of phone call, texts, and emails

President's Report, Ms. Fleming Reported:

- Attended the parish worship and music meeting
- Continue to work with Deacon Don to start a teen youth group for the parish at St. Pauls
- Went to the Mar-Lu-Ridge retreat
- Tom and Heidi will be joining by Affirmation of baptism on 12/3. Will have a fellowship for them

Parish Council, Ms. Caine Reported:

- Went over the Pastoral Agreement Roles and Responsibilities (the document was sent out to the congregation and council)
- Presented information from the Mar-Lu-Ridge Capital Campaign which was brought to the joint council from Sarah Lefler, executive director
- Voted that the offering during the Lent soup supper service will go towards the capital campaign
- Each church will take one of the 5 weeks of Lent soup suppers, St. Paul's has the first week
- Looking for volunteers to be delegates for Carroll Lutheran Village and Carroll Lutheran School

Property, Mr. Fleming Reported:

- Fixed the sign spotlight along 30
- Ordered an American flag for pavillion

New Business

- Emergency exit lighting
- Looking to install emergency signage in the overflow, sanctuary, and two in the basement
- It was suggested by the fire marshal to install these sings
- An estimate was provided for \$1,460, which included materials and installation

MOTION: move to install the four emergency exit signs and lighting with the cheaper of the two estimates not to exceed \$2,000 by Ms. Caine. Seconded by Mr. Hilgartner. All in favor. Motion carried.

Highlights from the December 12, 2023 Council Meeting

President's Report, Mr. Fleming Reported:

- Removed the wooden sign along Rt 30
- Attended the Hanover Road Assn meeting

Treasurer's Report, Ms. Mountcastle Reported:

- New contract with the landscaping company- the price is staying the same for the upcoming year. Mr. Fleming signed the new contract
- Two CD matured and rolled over to a 1 year CD
- One of the CD's was the Youth Gathering account which will not mature before the Youth Gathering payment is due

MOTION: Move to use church funds from the current account to defray the gathering costs until the CD matures, the money will be refunded back to the church account from the Youth Gathering account by Ms. Caine. Seconded by Mr. Hilgartner. All in favor. Motion carried.

Committee Reports

Parish Council, Ms. Caine Reported:

• A new format for sending the minutes out from the joint council meeting to the congregations will be discussed at the January meeting

Outreach, Ms. Lyons Reported:

- All the Christmas gifts for our adopted families and Vets were delivered. The congregation was generous; Outreach fund paid a little over \$250.00 for the balance.
- The Christmas Caroling Bus was another success. (\$415.00). The 5 visits we made were extremely uplifting! Many residents joined in and requested more!
- We're looking into providing "Blessing Bags" for the homeless.

Property, Mr. Fleming Reported:

- Trimmed the front roses
- Mulch is needed for around the church and the playground area
- The project will be presented to a scout for their Eagle Scout Project

Sunday School

- Continuing with class during worship.
- Planning an Easter skit for the Sunday after Easter
- On fellowship Sunday we will be asking the adults to participate in the outreach craft

Old Business

- Exit lights
- Two more electricians were contacted about installing the lights. One did not return the call and the other one gave a price of \$2,150
- Will go with The Merkson Electric Co, LLC estimate of \$1,460 to install the emergency exit lights

New Business

- Licenses-music
- CCLI is the licensing company
- One license for the Parish will be discussed at the next joint council meeting
- Will look into the current cost of the license before the payment is due to renew

MOTION: Move to pay the smallest amount to cover the cost of the license if the council is unable to meet before the bill is due, by Ms. Caine. Seconded by Mr. Knight. All in favor. Motion carried.

- Audit
- Council members and the financial secretary will meet to conduct the audit

- Sexton
- Detailed Services, LLC (443-857-4981) attended the council meeting and the council reviewed what needs to be cleaned in the church and gave them a tour of the church
- 2-4 hours a month will be set aside for cleaning, \$100 has been set aside for the service

MOTION: Move to accept the cleaning services by Detailed Services, by Ms. Lyons. Seconded by Mr. Hilgartner. All in favor. Motion carried.

- Adding a sign to the playground area with information about Sunday School and a "Play at Your Own Risk"
- Will look into doing face painting/crafts at the Flea Markets by the St. Paul's Youth for youth outreach
- Adding cameras to the outside of the church and park area
- Prices will be looked into for camera additions
- Park area lawn will need to be cleared of sticks before the first Flea Market in May
- Will ask the youth if they are interested in helping with this project
- A discussion followed about the church giving to Benevolence
- The Christmas Eve service offering will be given towards benevolence and this will be added into the bulletin to inform members/guests

Highlights from the January 16, 2024 Council Meeting

Pastor Dot Reported:

• Kept busy with hospital calls and visits, Saturday evening worship, home visits, grief visits, 6 Christmas Eve services, working on annual reporting for all of the congregations in the parish for the ELCA Synod, Bible study, council meeting, prayer ministry meeting, mutual ministry team meeting, St. Paul's planning meeting

President's Report, Mr. Fleming Reported:

- Held the annual planning session
- Reviewed our investments at Edward Jones with Tom Custance. Per our investment policy. Earned 10-12% in 2023
- A conservation followed about taking the interest from the account and putting into the SPY account for the youth group. There is a current line item of \$5,000 for the parish youth group so the interest will be put into a different account.
- Met with Detailed Services. Received forms for the treasurer Form 9 and certificate of insurance

Treasurer's Report, Ms. Mountcastle Reported:

- Change the president's name on the bank account, credit card, and BJ's card
- Received invoice for the envelopes- 30 for \$94.58
- No group rate for snow tubing, youth will need to give their receipt to the church for reimbursement

Flea Market, Ms. Lyons Reported:

• Updates have been sent to Rachel and the crew so our 2024 application should be ready next month. It will be emailed to our previous vendors and posted on our website. We're already receiving requests for seasonal spaces. Our map also needs updating. I will be negotiating a new contract with ASAP shortly.

Outreach, Ms. Lyons Reported:

- Looking for volunteers to cover our Food Grill each month. I've attached a sign up sheet listing the various duties and dates. Please help if you can.
- Checking to make sure our BJ's membership is current. I'll start scanning the flyer for specials in a couple weeks.

Property, Mr. Fleming Reported:

- Replacing the toilet seat in the mens restroom
- Snow moved off the parking lot but the contractor but he did not use salt, will have to reevaluate this discussion in the future especially if it snows on a Sunday

Old Business

- Playground
- Christopher Geldmacher will look into updating the playground as his Eagle Scout project

MOTION: To support Christopher Geldmacher in his Eagle Scout Project with an earmarking of \$2,500 to cover any additional fundraising needed to mulch the playground and flower beds by Ms. Lyons. Seconded by Mr. Hilgartner. All in favor. Motion carried.

New Business

- Food donation to Immanuel food pantry
- Ruth Bare estate
- Funds were given to the church, earmarked to cover maintenance of the building, pavilion, and church grounds.
- T-shirts
- T-shirts are ready to be ordered. Youth going to the gathering will receive a free shirt padi for by the gathering fund

MOTION: To use funds from the Special Events Fund to cover 50% of the t-shirt costs for church members not going to the Youth Gathering, by Ms. Baber. Seconded by Ms. Lewis. All in favor. Motion carried.

- New White Paraments
- Current ones are torn and turning yellow. Green Paraments were replaced March 2022 for a cost of \$1,700
- The idea was brought up to purchase new paraments and dedicated the paraments to the Bare Family
- Money would be used from abiding memorial
- CM Almy was the company used previously

MOTION: To replace the white paraments, upon bringing proposals to council to vote on, using funds from abiding memorial in memory of the Bare Family by Ms. Lewis. Seconded by Ms. Caine.

- Mutual Ministry
- A once a month healing service idea was brought up at the meeting. Would be around communion and people would be invited to come to the front to receive communion and a special prayer. Service would be shortened a bit to have time for the addition of the healing service. Will try for a period of time- 6 months- and then bring comments and thoughts to the Parish Music and Worship Committee
- Looking into making the services more uniform between the churches in the parish
