"From the Pastor"

I had the opportunity to attend the Interfaith Prayers for Peace service sponsored by the Westminster Ministerium and held at the United Methodist Church on May 2, the National Day of Prayer.

We were not large in number (about 20) but the Holy Spirit was present and working in, through, and among those who gathered. We shared sacred Scripture, readings, and prayers from the Christian and Muslim faiths. We had one person of the Jewish faith represented. The overwhelming takeaway, palpable and present, is that we are all one, united by the loving Spirit of God. And we all desire peace.

We joined our hearts and spirits listening to and viewing an inspiring music video entitled "The Wisdom Knot" about the making of an international peace music album, "Sapient: A Cantata for Peace" recorded, arranged, produced by Steven Chesne. It captures beautifully the music of many indigenous peoples, the Cheyenne, the Kikuyu, and those of many faith traditions: Buddhists, Sikhs, Muslims, Judaism, Christians, and many more.

 wash cloth, toothbrush/toothpaste, hand sanitizer, socks, gloves, tissues, assorted candy bars and crackers, etc.
 Our contact requested hand warmers and blankets which we are also providing.

- Audit- process is finished


New Business
