"We have observed his star at its rising and have come to worship him." Matt. 2.2



HAPPY NEW YEAR! Happy Epiphany!

We have made it through the rush and wonders of Advent and the holiness of Christmas. At the start of this new year, we find ourselves once again at Epiphany, making our way along a rough and well-worn road with a caravan of camels for company, as we, and the Wise Men, are guided by the light of a star.

We, like those ancient wise ones, may not have a clue as to where this journey into the New Year will take us. We only know that we follow the light of a star that will bring us to us to the true Light. This light is the Light (as John reminds us in his gospel) that no darkness in our lives or in our world can truly overpower.

This Light is our strength to move forward even in uncertainty. This Light is Jesus Christ. And just as it was with the Magi as the star stopped and led them to Jesus and they were filled joy (Matthew 2:10), our joy and hope and our way forward into a new year rests in the One who loves us unconditionally. We are blessed no matter what shape our road is in or what lies ahead. And we are forgiven and loved always.

I share a poem with you from *Sanctified Art*. The author is Rev. Sarah (Are) Speed. I hope it brings a sense of joy and celebration as it did for me. It is called; "You are a Blessing."

If you hear nothing else [in this new year], If the wind howls, If your brain runs amok, If rebuttals and denials line up like little toy soldiers, then hear this— You are a blessing. I knew it from the first moment I met you/heard your name/ learned that there are 7 billion of us on this planet. I knew it in my bones, the way my feet knew the way home. You are a blessing. For our creating God breathed life into your being. And there is simply no way that, along with that life, some of God's goodness didn't slip right in.

So tell the rebuttals to rest. Tell the toy soldiers to find another hill, because this one is reserved for joy and celebration. You are a blessing. Breathe it in.

Yes, breathe it in. This time after Epiphany and before Lent begins with Ash Wednesday is a time for us to remember that God created good and that includes us. Seek the light of Christ in the midst of the weariness. Hold on to the memory that we were created for good and the hope that can bring. Share the hope of that light with others. Because, no matter what, we are loved and blessed.

President's Report, Mr. Fleming Reported

- Old sign- added the church email address and lights to the sign
- LP Tank- company notified and it will costs \$135 to remove and the church will be credited with the value of the
 amount of oil in the tank
- Electric stove- Purchased stove at Lowes for \$2,436. A credit card was opened to save a percentage on future
 purchases. Lowes will deliver, install, and remove the old stove (for \$50). Tax referred for the stove purchase
- CDs rollover at 4.15% for one more year

Treasurer's Report, Ms. Mountcastle Reported:

- 50% of the following accounts Abiding Memorial, Capital Improvement, Good Sam, Park Improvement, Building Fund were removed and placed into a CD for 6 months at 4.25%
- Off budget for giving- about \$5,000 off
- Mission Support discussion next month- Christmas envelopes go towards mission support
