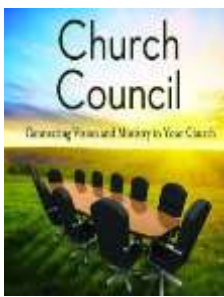

Looking ahead:

- Parish Newsletters are back on a regular monthly schedule. Will soon be transitioning to weekly eblasts of a few announcements and bi-monthly newsletters per bishop recommendations
- Parish Book Club has begun and off to a great start.
- Planning a fundraiser for the spring iteration of College Care Packages in March. In April, we will be collecting items for the care packages. They will be sent out the week of Easter so that they arrive by May.
- Youtherans is back on the schedule.
- Parish bible study has been planned.

As we continue in this time of transition, a lot of things are still unknown. But trusting that the Spirit is at work, we push forward knowing that the Church has stood through greater trials. I am incredibly thankful for the opportunity to work alongside Pastor Dot and incredibly saddened that our Parish will be losing such a loving and caring leader. I thank God for her ministry here knowing she walked with many folks through life changing events in her time here. I hold her in prayer through her transition into Interim ministry with St. Benjamins and trust that the Spirit is guiding her still into ministry and service with wonderful people who will be blessed by her presence.

President's Report, Mr. Fleming Reported

- Edward Jones five CDs renewed at 4.2 for 1 year
- SHA project Dover & RT. 30
 - Offering the church for the land being used for the road work- 274 sf x \$2.35 = \$643.90 and 379 st ft x \$1.03 = \$390.37

MOTION: to have Leon sign the paperwork with the State Highway Administration to move forward with the RT 30. project and receive the funds by Ms. Caine. Seconded by Ms. Lyons. All in favor. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report, Ms. Mountcastle Reported:

- Edward Jones statement has not yet been received
- Received the January BGE bill for \$1,063 which is about double the amount of prior months

Committee Reports

Parish Council, Ms. Caine Reported:

- Next meeting on 2/19, the Bishop will not be at this meeting
- Will bring up questions and comments from the Special Congregational Meeting

- Parish Worship and Music Meeting Discussion:
 - Shrove Tuesday at St. Paul's
 - St. Paul's will have an Ash Wednesday Service
 - Lenten Soup Suppers- will rotate between the churches
 - Maundy Thursday Service at St. Paul's
 - Three different services for Good Friday, not at St. Paul's
 - Sundays and Seasons subscription- looking into a getting a parish subscription
- Idea being brought up at the parish council meeting: having a joint parish service during the fifth Sunday of the month (four times a year)

Outreach, Ms. Lyons Reported:

- Maidie and I delivered a shopping bag full of cancelled stamps to Cross Keys Village. We got a little tour and information on their group.
- We'll again be operating the food grill at every flea market as our sole fundraiser. Need volunteers.

Flea Market, Ms. Lyons Reported:

- Our 2025 application has been emailed to previous vendors. (see attached) I've asked Lori to update our website with the new dates and info. Emailed Sandy and Rachel the new app and info. so they can start advertising.
- Our letter to BJ's has been submitted requesting gift cards each month.
- Our contract with ASAP has been approved with an increase.
 - Standard Unit - \$95 (last year \$90)
 - Handicapped Unit - \$175 (last year \$150)
- Delivery will be made on April 18th. Units cleaned each Wednesday. They want us to provide a trash can. I contacted two other port-a-pot companies; neither came close to the prices we're currently paying.

Property, Mr. Knight Reported:

- Gathering prices for electric for shed, painting inside of church upstairs, refinishing floor in basement, & price for chair lift.
 - \$1,750 (\$2,000 to cover addition supplies and motion sensor lights) was the quote for the electric and a light for the park shed
 - Obtaining quotes for painting the church, so far \$21,000 and \$24,000 but looking to get two more prices
 - Chair Lift is about 35-40 years old and no company will maintain the lift because of its age. The companies are recommending replacing the lift
 - Refinishing basement floor- contacting the company that refinished the floors last time (about 10 years ago)

Old Business

- Piano was fixed and tuned- \$250

New Business

- Sponsoring an amount for CLS BINGO

MOTION: to donate \$100 towards CLS for their BINGO in honor of our 4th Grade Friends in Faith class from the church special events fund by Ms. Baber and seconded by Mr. Martin. All in favor. Motion carried.

- Bishop is coming March 19th to meet with us and tell us the "Plan"
- It has been announced to the Joint Council that Pastor Cannie Miller will be coming on to be Campus Pastor for St. Peter's and St. Abrahams.
- Looking to create a home visitation team in each congregation to help assist in Pastoral Visitations
- A family in the community is looking for a Lutheran church in the area for a funeral- will use St. Paul's for the funeral

During this transition, I'm the only pastor handling day to day items and trying to make sure things are not falling through the cracks. Please do not hesitate to reach out if you find that something needs attention. I'm thankful for the grace that has been extended thus far. Some days it feels like I've been here 10 years, and others I'm reminded that I'm still very new and there is much I still don't know about the parish. I'm excited to continue on our journey together though.
